Welcome

Welcome to the first edition of our newly formatted church newsletter, a joint venture between Maud & Savoch and New Deer: St Kane's Churches. In the past, each congregation produced its own weekly notice sheet which traditionally acted like a weekly calendar of events pertinent to the life of the congregation. Covid restrictions brought a halt to this until last year when the concept of a notice sheet was reintroduced monthly.

At the last joint meeting of the two Kirk Sessions, the matter of improving our communication pathways was discussed and for a number of reasons it was concluded that the provision of a quarterly notice sheet or newsletter may better address our intentions, allowing us to provide you with significantly improved advance notification of services, meetings and other events pertinent to congregational life, in particular those around the Christian festivals of Christmas and Easter when our programme of events tends to be considerably busier.



Presbytery News

Church of Scotland Mission Partner, Fiona Kendall will be visiting Presbytery on Monday 26th February to share with us about the work of Mediterranean Hope. a refugee project created by the Federation of Protestant Churches in Italy (FCEI) that she is European and Legal Affairs advisor to.

We hear daily in the media of the horrendous plight of refugees and the risks that they take trying to get to a safer place with all too often tragic consequences. The thought of leaving our homeland, loved ones and all that we have behind to risk our lives for something unknown is unthinkable to the majority of us – yet it is happening to so many on a daily basis. When they arrive safely the journey is far from over as they face continued barriers and challenges waiting in camps for a way forwards in the hope of resettlement and a future.

During her visit there will be a number of opportunities to meet with Fiona (face to face and on line) and we are really fortunate that Fiona will be coming to spend an afternoon with us at St Kane's Church Centre to tell us more about the work of Mediterranean Hope, the work that she does and the challenges that refugees are facing.

Join us from 2.30 to 5.00 pm at St Kane's Church Centre to meet with Fiona and hear the work of Mediterranean Hope.

Afternoon tea will be served after we have heard from Fiona.
